

ALSO COURSE AT UIC

The Department of Family Medicine at UIC will be hosting the AAFP & AMA Category I CME-accredited ALSO Course on Friday and Satudrday, March 2-3, 2007. The course will be held on the UIC campus, at the UIC Student Center West and College of Medicine Research Building. Co-directing will be Drs. Glenda Rios, UIC DFM, and Kate Gunnell, Hinsdale Hospital Family Medicine Residency Program. Dr. Lise Weisberger, U of I/Advocate Illinois Masonic Family Medicine Residency Program, will serve as Advisory Faculty. Faculty participants in the planning and teaching of the course include: Drs.
