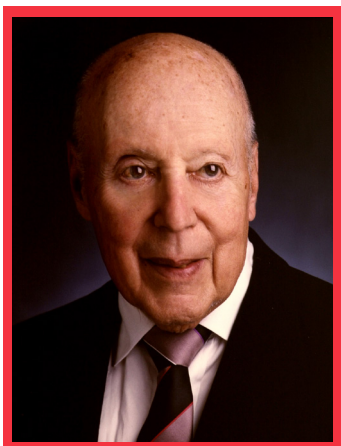

Dr. Eugene Folk was the first Director of Pediatric Ophthalmology at the Illinois Eye and Ear Infirmary (IEEI), and served in this role until 1984. Dr. Folk trained over 200 residents and more than 30 fellows in pediatric ophthalmology and strabismus during his tenure at the IEEI. Dr. Folk was a teacher, a mentor, a friend to many, and certainly an advocate for children. For those who had the privilege of training with Dr. Folk, strabismus and pediatric ophthalmology was exciting, challenging, confusing, but *never* boring.

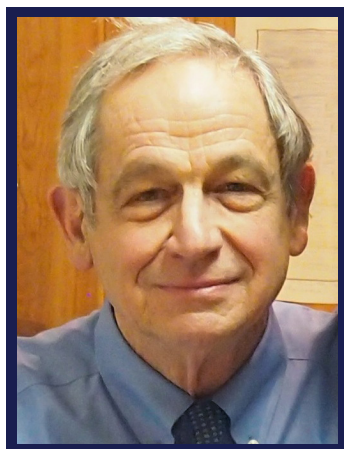
